Europe hit hardest by climate crisis in 2022

Effects felt in Devon

In the news this week we learned that Europe experienced its warmest summer on record, with temperatures increasing more than twice the global average in the last three decades. The EU's climate monitoring service – Copernicus – also revealed that that 2022 was the fifth warmest year globally.

In the UK we experienced a record-breaking summer of extreme heat and droughts.

According to Samantha Burgess, deputy director of the Copernicus Climate Change Service, we are getting dangerously close to breaching the 1.5C limit budgeted for under the Paris Climate Agreement. We are now expected to hit 1.5C of warming in early 2030.

At the time of writing this, other meteorological agencies are expected to report their 2022 data later this week, which should give us further insight into the state of the Climate.

In Devon we are starting to see the impacts of climate change much more frequently, with wetter and warmer winters and hotter and dryer summers. Data from the Westcountry Rivers Trust shows South West England is experiencing almost 10% more rainfall over the year now than in 1961.

Devon is the only UK county with two coastlines with many coastal communities located in areas which are flat and low lying. According to Devon Climate Emergency (DCE) many of these communities are located in areas of reclaimed land or around exposed beaches which puts them at risk from flooding from coastal erosion and rising sea levels

A 2019 research project conducted for East Devon by the University of the West of England focused on the impact of flooding - assuming a worst-case scenario of global average temperature increases of up to 4.8°C. It showed that by 2100, in a maximum flood event, flooding would overwhelm up to 193 km of roads, including 2km of motorway and 13km of A-roads. The railway would also be affected, with 19km under water, effectively cutting off Exeter from the rest of the UK. Food supplies would also be hit by severe flooding of 45 square kilometres of cropland. This is just East Devon. The effects on the rest of the county are likely to be similar.

Closer to home, this week saw the River Teign burst its banks, with much of Teigngrace under water. This caused havoc on the roads, with heavy congestion and gridlock on the Exeter Road.
